Give it all you've got – come off the field with nothing in the tank; don't die wondering; if you don't run much have a run – you may just catch the opposition off-guard; have no thoughts of self preservation; be totally committed; do at least one special thing, something you can be really proud of – be it a break, a covering tackle, a long touch finder, win against the feed/throw etc etc; and play some ad lib rugby, throw caution to the wind - if there's one thing that drives me nuts these days it's too much structure.'

Squirter's Rugby History

In case you haven't been around the club for all of the last 21 years, here is a potted rugby history of one **Craig 'Squirter' Leach**.

Craig Leach started his rugby career at Brisbane Boys College where he was sent to boarding school as a 12 year

old. His parents **Mal** and **Wendy Leach** worked Mount Ringwood Station just south of Adelaide River and so both of their boys, Cameron then Craig, had to leave home for their schooling.

When Craig finished year 12 he returned to work in the Territory and by then rugby had become his game of choice. He **joined Palmerston Rugby Union Club in 1985** and began playing in C grade. Within no time he was called up into A Grade where he remained for most of the rest of his career.

At Palmerston in those days he can remember **massive forward packs** who fed on small unsuspecting backs such as himself. He was given his **nickname of 'Squirter'** by just such a forward, **Tony Morris**, who coined it because of Craig's skinny body. Craig says it was these large forwards who helped harness his skill of elusive running and fast release of the ball.

The half back in those days was his brother Cameron and the two soon formed a great partnership which lasted for nearly 100 games.

In Craig's time at Palmerston he has won many awards; A Grade Best and Fairest in 1996/97, Best Back three times. He was awarded the club's highest honour of **Life Member No 10** in 2003.

Craig has **played in all three of Palmerston's winning A Grade Grand Finals**. A big moment in Craig's rugby career came in 1992 when he **captained the NT representative side to an historic 17-16 win over Scotland** at Rugby Park in Darwin.

From 1992 until 1994 Craig moved south to try his hand at rugby in Sydney where he played for Eastern Suburbs. On returning to Darwin Craig slotted back into the NT side and Palmerston. In 2000, when the Mosquitoes concept was born for the NT representative side, Craig was the first captain. He **played 55 games for the NT** between 1988 and 2001 including being captain during 1990-1992 and 1995-2000.

He remembers well when he was moved from his favourite #10 spot to inside centre against Queensland when Kris Shirley took the #10 position. His opposite opponent was Tim Horan who went on to make the inside centre position his own with the Wallabies for many years. It was a long day at the office trying to contain the running skills of Horan.

Craig is proud that he has played rugby in every state of Australia. Also, he has represented the NT U20s in Taiwan and captained the Mosquitoes in Sri Lanka. He remembers well his battles with such greats of the game as Wylie Lingman. He has traveled with his first love rugby and met some great friends and had great experiences. He counts **playing NT representative rugby with his brother Cameron as one of his great thrills.**

While not admitting to be ready to hang up the boots yet, Craig is preparing for life off the field. He has recently married Mel and they have a lovely daughter Jessie. Craig is this year coaching the NT U16 side which will soon travel to Sydney for the national championships. He is a level 2 national coach and is

interested in pursuing this side of the game.

On Saturday when Craig runs on to the field for Palmerston for the 300th time in A grade, his parents Mal and Wendy will surely be there as they have been for nearly all of the 300 games. They traveled from the station at Mount Ringwood for many years until they moved to Bachelor and then continued their weekend journey to support their son, a return journey of over 200km.

Final's Series Rules

The NTRU and the Club Presidents have **agreed the following for the finals series:**

- The A Grade 15 that play on the weekend will be ineligible for their B Grade on the following two

weekends if their team is eliminated or goes straight through to the Grand Final.

- The scrum policy will be:
 - A Grade as per the laws of the game;
 - B Grade are required to have 4 front rowers;
 - The replacement front row forwards on the reserves bench must be marked on the team sheet.
- All replacement players must report to the touch judge before going on to the field. This includes replacements made at half time informing the touch judge.
- All clubs are to talk to players to control the excessive swearing that has been creeping into the game in the last few weeks.
- All games must commence on time.
